Executive Summary <i>(Please provide, within this page, an executive summary of the project.)</i>	
<p>Sub-degree students usually find it difficult to find their first job. This problem is caused by multiple reasons. On one hand, the students do not have complete information about the job market and the industry. On the other hand, the graduates generally lack of job-hunting skills. Unfortunately, self-financing institutions typically lack resource to provide supports to the students. With support of Quality Enhancement Support Scheme, Caritas Bianchi College of Careers (CBCC) plan to launch a whole college approach industrial attachment programme to tackle these problems.</p> <p>Firstly, we will organise industrial career seminars to provide industrial information to the students. Company visits will also be conducted to help students to get first-hand information about the companies. Professional bodies will also be invited to share information with students so that the students can have more in-depth understanding about the industry. These activities will enhance students' knowledge about the industry and help them to better plan for their careers.</p> <p>Secondly, we plan to enhance internship support to students. The Project Officer will develop a set of training materials and conduct a series internship training workshops to enhance students' job hunting skills, for example, interview skills, preparation of resume and cover letter, career planning, etc. Moreover, we will provide internship support services, including, consultation, aptitude test, editing of resume and cover letter, mock interview, etc.</p> <p>Thirdly, we will source more internship opportunities for the student. The project team will visit the companies in order to solicit more internship opportunities. Selected companies will be invited to serve as industrial partner who will provide internship opportunities on a regular basis. In addition, a large scale career fair will be organised to demonstrate the potential of our students. At the same time, some potential employer will be invited to set up information counter. The career fair will bridge students to employers.</p> <p>Fourthly, we will promote whole college approach internship programme. The existing programmes will be reviewed. Internship will be incorporated into the programme gradually. At the same time, we will develop new programmes with industrial attachment. Students can gain working experience from the internship programme. At the same time, the internship experience will help students to develop their interpersonal and communication skills. These skills will be very useful when the students join the workforce.</p> <p>A whole college approach industrial attachment programme will be implemented. The internship programme not only provides students work experience but also help students to develop skills required at workplace. This project will better prepare students for the job market and hence enhance students' employability</p>

<p>CBCC has offered vocational and professional education and training (VPET) programmes for forty years. As it is widely known, internship which provides a practice opportunity to student is a critical success factor to VPET. However, there is no college-wide internship programme in CBCC. On the other hand, the college only provides limited supports to internship. As a result, we will implement a whole college approach industrial attachment programme. We aim at enhancing internship support services and provide more internship opportunities to students. Finally, we will incorporate the internship into formal curriculum gradually.</p>

<p>Because we will implement a whole college approach industrial attachment programme, the existing 300 sub-degree students at Caritas Bianchi College of Careers (CBCC) will be directly benefited from the programme. After open of the new campus of Caritas Institute of Higher Education (CIHE), the CIHE students will be moved from CBCC campus to CIHE new campus. Subsequently, the CBCC campus will have space to offer more programme. It is expected that the number of CBCC students will increase to 1000 in near future.</p> <p>These students can enjoy the support services provided by the project. On the other hand, the internship programme will help students to enhance their generic and career development skills. Students will also gain more information about the industry. These core competences are essential to their future career development. Moreover, the students can gain working experience through the industrial attachment programme. We expect that their employability will be greatly enhanced.</p> <p>On the other hand, we will reserve a certain percentage seats of industrial career seminars for the students from other institutions. Moreover, the career fair will be open to all students in the self-financing institutions. As a result, the number of beneficiaries will be more than the number of students at CBCC.</p>

Project Sustainability

The estimated amount of recurrent expenditure for the project is around 0.5 million dollars per year. As internship will become a component in our academic programmes, resources will be provided to the academic departments for implementation of the college-wide internship programme. Upon completion of the project, the college will provide extra funding to the Student Affairs Office to continue to offer industrial attachment programme.

If necessary, we may finance the internship programme by donation in addition to the operational budget of the College. We raised \$100 million last year. Based on our track record in fund-raising, we are confident that we can raise sufficient amount of money for the internship programme and other student support services. In fact, a number of potential donors have expressed their intention to donate money.

Summing up the above, sufficient resources will be allocated to the project to ensure that the project will continue beyond the project period.
